If you heat ice, it melts.

#### Type 1

Type 1	if-clause (hypothesis)	Main clause (result)	Use
real	if + Present Simple unless (= if not)	Future, Imperative can / must / may + bare infinitive	real or very probable situation in the present or future

If he comes late, we'll miss the bus.

If you can't afford it, don't buy it. = Unless you can afford it, don't buy it.

If you see her, can you give her a message?

### Type 2

Type 1	if-clause (hypothesis)	Main clause (result)	Use
unreal present	if + Past Simple	would / could / might	improbable situation in the present or future; also used to give advice

If I were you, I would see a doctor. (advice)
If I had money, I could buy a new car. (But I don't have enough money to buy one.)
(improbable situation)

#### Type 3

Type 1	if-clause (hypothesis)	Main clause (result)	Use
unreal past		would / could / might +	unreal or improbable situation in the past; also used to express regret and criticism

If you hadn't been rude, he wouldn't have punished you. (But you were rude and he punished you.) (criticism)

Study the following notes:

We put a comma after the if-clause when it comes first.

If we go by plane, it will be more expensive. It will be more expensive if we go by plane.

- Unless means if not.
   We'll go for a picnic unless it rains.
   We'll go for a picnic if it doesn't rain.
- After if, we can use were instead of was in all persons.

If I were you, I wouldn't spend so much money.

 We do not usually use will, would or should in an if-clause.

If we take a taxi, we won't be late.

NOT If we will take a taxi, we won't be late.

However, we use should after if when we are not sure about a possibility.

If I see him, I'll give it to him. (Perhaps I will see him.)

If I should see him, I'll give it to him. (Perhaps I'll see him but I'm not sure.)
