
## **Present Perfect Continuous**

## Form: has / has been + verb -ing

I have been working. You have been working. He has been working. She has been working. It has been working. We have been working. You have been working. You have been working. ## Present Perfect Continuous is used:

 for actions which started in the past and continue up to the present.



He has been making a cake since 11 o'clock. (He's still making a cake.)

- for past actions of certain duration which have visible results or effects, in the present.
   Bob is very tired. He has been working all day long.
- to express irritation, anger, annoyance, explanation or criticism.
   Who has been reading my business papers? (showing anger)
- to put emphasis on duration, usually with for, since or how long.
   I've been typing letters since 9 o'clock.

Present Perfect is used:

for actions recently completed.



He has made a cake.

(The cake is in his hand, so the action has finished.)

for actions which happened at an unstated time.

James has bought a new car.

- to express personal experiences or changes which have happened.
   l've lost a lot of weight.
- put emphasis on number.
   l've only typed three letters since 9 o'clock

**Note:** With the verbs live, feel and work we can use either Present Perfect or Present Perfect Continuous with no difference in meaning.

I've been living in London for a year. or I've lived in London for a year.

Non-continuous verbs are not used in Present Perfect Continuous (know, believe see, like, love, taste, understand, want, etc.)

I've known her since 2002. (NOT: I've been knowing her since 2002.)

Time adverbs used with Present Perfect Continuous:	Time adverbs and expressions used with Present Perfect:
for, since, how long	just, ever, never, always, already, yet, for, since, so far, how long, recently, today, this week / month / year, once, etc.


